The Degree Program

The Multidisciplinary BA program has three main concentrations from which you have a choice of introductory and advancedlevel courses. These are: Jewish Canonical Texts (Hebrew Bible, Talmud, Jewish Philosophy); History of the Jewish People and their Land (Jewish History, Land of Israel Studies and Archaeology, Middle Eastern Politics); and Jewish Creativity (Hebrew Literature, Hebrew Language, Jewish Art).

This international program is taught entirely in English and integrates students from all over the world.

In addition, you will have the opportunity to study courses from other departments including English Literature, Linguistics, Communications, or Political Studies (in English). You can also register for a dual-major, combining your program with any of these fields of study.



Honors Program

The Multidisciplinary Department enables certain students to participate in the Cramim Jewish Studies Honors Program. Cramim is an opportunity for outstanding students with good Hebrew to immerse themselves in areas such as Jewish history, culture, literature, language, and philosophy. Most of the courses are only available in Hebrew.

Unlike most Israeli academic majors, Cramim enables participants to develop a deep understanding of your chosen field of study by also exposing you to subjects, texts, and great thinkers from related disciplines.
